## Institute Financial Support For Students with External Support- Policy

### **1. Summary Statement**

This policy outlines the institute's extent to financially support students who are simultaneously receiving external financial support.

### **2. Purpose of Policy**

To set a guideline for financial support for TTI-C students who also receive external financial support. TTI-C can more effectively support its students and expand the student body with an efficient financial support policy and procedure(s).

### **3. Policy Applies To:**

Students who are accepted to TTI-C after April of 2006, and enroll in classes; and the Bursar's Office.

### **5. Policy Detail:**

The Toyota Technological Institute at Chicago expects to support all students who make satisfactory progress toward a doctorate degree. This support includes full tuition and a monthly living costs stipend during the academic year that is competitive with offers made by other top-ranked schools. The institute also encourages prospective and enrolled students to apply for externally funded grants and fellowships.

As students need not participate in any supplementary teaching or assistance programs to earn their stipends (besides continual effort in making satisfactory progress towards their degree- as determined by the Chief Academic Officer and their Advisor), if a student receives external funding (from NSF, an outside entity, etc.) their funding from TTI-C will be adjusted so that for ever two dollars of external funding, TTI-C will reduce its offer by one dollar.
